Consent Form for School Trips and Other On-Site / Off-Site Activities

You give permission for your child:

1. To take part in school trips and other activities that take place off school premises and on-site boarding activities during the school day (if applicable); and
2. To be given first aid or urgent medical treatment during any school trip or activity. You must keep the Health and Wellbeing Centre (medicalcentre@pocklingtonschool.com) /Prep Matron (prepmatron@pocklingtonschool.com) up to date with any changes to medical conditions, allergies, medication and medical care plans.

Please note the following important information before giving your consent

- The trips and activities covered by this consent include:
 - all visits (including residential trips) which take place during the holidays, evenings or a weekend
 - adventure activities at any time
 - off-site sporting fixtures outside the school day
 - all off-site activities for nursery schools.
- The school will send you information about each trip or off-site activity before it takes place.
- You can, if you wish, tell the school that you do not want your child to take part in any particular school trip or activity.

Written parental consent will **not** be requested from you for the majority of off-site activities offered by the school, for example year-group visits to local amenities, as such activities are part of the school's curriculum and usually take place during the normal school day. In addition, we will **not** request your specific consent for scheduled school sports fixtures, Lower Sixth community action activities and boarding trips or on-site boarding activities.

We will seek your specific consent for all educational visits that incur a charge or take place in the school holidays/outside of the normal school hours. Additional medical updates will be requested on an individual trip basis in these instances.
